C.E.M.S.

The Secretary of the Bream Branch, Mr. C. Thomas, has been appointed as one of the two representatives from the Forest Federation, to attend the Annual C.E.M.S. Conference. The Conference this year is being held at Bournemouth, on May 31st, and June 1st, and consists of representatives from branches all over England.

The attention of members is particularly called to the Annual Meeting of our own Branch on Tuesday, June 21st, at 7.0 p.m. If fine, this meeting will be held in the Vicarage Garden, but should the evening be wet or stormy the meeting will be held at the Schools.

Owing to the fact of the present industrial dispute it was found impossible to hold the Federation Meeting at Newnham last month, and for the same reason the majority of members will be unable to attend the Diocesan Gathering of the C.E.M.S. at Gloucester, on Saturday, June 11th.

Some members of our branch have been making good use of this time of enforced idleness by doing a large amount of voluntary repair work and painting at the Church, thus saving the Church Expenses a considerable expenditure. No doubt members of the congregation have already noticed the vast improvement in the Church Porch, which for some years has been in a bad state of repairs.

Sunday School.

As before long the question of the Summer Treat will be under consideration, it is as well, that parents and others interested in the children should understand what are the necessary attendances for a child to make in order to qualify for a treat. The minimum number of marks required is 60 per cent. of morning and afternoon attendances since the last treat. This qualification was decided upon by the Teachers at a meeting in November last, and of course all the children have been informed of the fact ever since.

As regards prizes, these are decided upon the marks for the whole year, viz. : from Advent to the last Sunday after Trinity, and a very high percentage is required both morning and afternoon. From this it will be seen that a high standard is required in the Sunday School, but at the same time it is one that the children can easily reach if only their parents help them to be regular. And there is no doubt that it helps the children to realise the privileges of being able to attend Sunday School, and the self-sacrificing work required from all those who teach in a Sunday School.

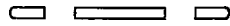
