The holder must sign his name and enter wis address and dato of siLting on the B3opa Counterfeit (Redi and take the book to the bacon retailer. The retailer will enter his name and addreza fin the groper space numbered 11 on the in ide of the corer and on the back of fie counterfoil, and will detach and keep the counterfoil.
3. Persons living in beardingshotses, hotels, schools, and similar establishments, should not register their Supplementary Ration Doolie until they leave tho eatroblithment.
4. The Supplementary Ration Book may bo used only by or for the holder, and only for so Ions as he continues to do work of a class which entities him to Supplementary Rations. When tho holder coves to be eifitiled to Supplementary Rations this book must be given up to tho Local Food Office.
5. Tho Supplementary Ration Bonk may only bo nod while the holder is living in Great Britain, th not drawing Government cations, and is not in an institution chobsital, asylum. workhouse, Xi.). If the dies. Joins thai ilotces, of enters an institution, tho book mist be riven up to the proper authotiok, that is to my , tho Renfintrar of Deaths, that Naval, Military, or Ais Force Authority, of the head of the institution, as the case may he, If the holder is teaviod Great Britain for a period exceeding far weeks the book must be riven up to the Aliment 1 Offer on embarkation. Dutint a diorite absence from the country the book may be retincer,bal must be produced to the Actions' Officer for inspection on embarkation, it must not be ween during absence, and all the coupons for the period of absenon mutt be detichod and destroyed. Any book pol given in to the proper authority in any of the above cases mast be returned at once to the nearest Pood Outrace.
6. Levis 1 and 2 with their coupons on, If desired, be detached as a whole, by cutting along the line XX , and can be depesitcad with the retailer with whom the book is registered for

## INSTRUCTIONS.

1. The person named as the holder of this Ration Book on the Reference Leaf (page 6) (Green) mast sign his name in the space provided on that leaf, and must copy in the space provided for it on the Reference leaf the Serial Number appearing at the head of this cover.
2. The Book must be registered at once for the purchase of Sugar, Fats (i.e. Butter, Margarine and Lard). Butcher's Meat and Bacon. To register for Sugar the holder meat sin in his name and enter lis address and date of signing on the Sugar Counterfoil (Fellow), and take the book to the sugar retailer. The retailer will enter his name and address in the proper space (numbered 1) on the inside of the cover and on the back of the coanterfofi, abl will detach and keep the counterfoil. Registration for other foods will be effected in the same way, by use of the counterfoils for Fats (Blue), Butcher's Meat (Red), and Bacon (Red).
3. Persons living in hotels, boarding houses, hostels, schools and similar establishmints should not register their Ration Books until they leave the establishment.
4. The Ration Book may be used only by or on behalf of the holder, to buy rationed food for him or members of the sine household or guests sharing common meals. It may not be used to obtain rationed food for others.
5. The Ration Book may only be used while the holder is living in Great Britain, is not drawing Govermineat rations, and is not in an institution (hrespita), asylum, workhouse, \&C.). If he dies or joins the forces, or enters an institution, the book must be given up to the proper authority, that is to say, the Registrar of Deaths, the naval, military or air force authority, or the head of the institution, as the case may be. If the holder is leaving Great Britain for a period exceeding four weeks the book must
